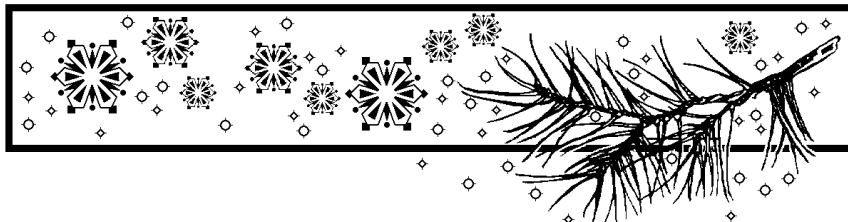

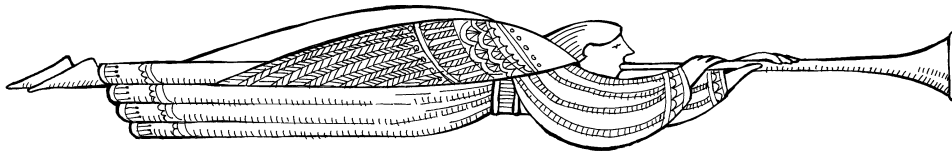
Fellowship Time

Stephen Ministry at King of Glory

Since 1975 Stephen Ministry has been helping congregations develop high-quality lay caring ministry – ministry that brings Christ’s care to people whose needs for care might otherwise go unmet. Over 11,000 congregations and organizations currently have Stephen Ministry programs, with 159 denominations being represented in all fifty states, ten Canadian provinces, and twenty-three countries. Stephen Ministry is led by lay people who have been trained as Stephen Leaders at an intensive seven day Leaders’ Training Course. Stephen Leaders oversee and direct Stephen Ministry in their congregations. Stephen Ministers are lay people who have received an initial fifty hours of training in providing emotional and spiritual care; plus an additional seventeen plus hours of focused training and ongoing continuing education.

Here at King of Glory we currently have two trained Stephen Leaders, Brenda Sheffer and Kathy Marks. They have been leading King of Glory’s Stephen Ministry since 2008. They have devoted an untold number of hours to leading Stephen Ministry on behalf of our congregation, including the recruitment, selection, training and supervision of Stephen Ministers. Additionally, Stephen Leaders explore ways to identify potential care receivers within our congregation (as well as within the community). Stephen Leaders contact and interview potential care receivers, and when appropriate, they make a Stephen Ministry assignment. Stephen Ministers sign covenants to provide confidential Christian care to their care receivers and make commitments to serve for at least two years. Several of King of Glory’s Stephen Ministers [Donna Althoff, Gail DeMattio, and Don Pasquine] have been in continuous service since Stephen Ministry was introduced in 2006, and they were commissioned in 2007. Brenda Sheffer and Kathy Marks have also been in continuous service since being commissioned as Stephen Ministers in 2007, assigned to caring relationships and then as already mentioned as Stephen Leaders since 2008. A second class of Stephen Ministers was commissioned in June of 2010 including: Beverly Behm, Elaine Davis, Frank Fleischer, Jeanne Millar, and Walt Muller. All of King of Glory’s Stephen Ministers have had at least one care giving assignment; some have had multiple assignments. The evaluations care receivers have given about their experience with Stephen Ministry have all been extremely positive. The next Stephen Ministry training sessions are planned for 2012.

Kathy Marks helped form (and leads) a network of the Stephen Ministry congregations in the Grand Strand area in 2009. This network shares the wealth of talent, the abundance of great caring ministry ideas, and the richness of caring community. The network has provided Stephen Ministers for care receivers in one another’s congregations when issues have made this helpful.

Memories at KOG

We joined KOG in 1984. At that time George Fill was director of the choir. It was a full group. He was also a talent director of short skits which we performed before the congregation. Later, Randy Bayne came to our church to direct the choir. It grew to forty-five members. He was a great director and very precise about how we said our words. Sometimes we would lay on the floor or massage each other’s backs for relaxation. You felt at ease singing with others. We performed at the Alabama Theater and at Williamsburg, VA, with other choirs. What fun we had with each other.

When Hugo hit us in 1989, a group was formed called the King’s Carpenters and the Queens of Glory. Starting in Georgetown, we cleaned and helped those in need. Our pastor, Luther Swicegood at the helm decided we needed to go farther south, so of we go to McClellandville. It was hit very hard. People were rescued from under their roofs. Where there were no electric lines to run our equipment, the men ran lines to make it possible. The town is a very old fishing village with a port for selling their catch. Most all the homes were flooded, even their beautiful little church. Food and clothing were delivered several times.

Later the town of Athens, GA, was flooded by a dam break. So off we go again with a trusty crew, pastor again in the lead. We stayed in the basement of a small church. One church lady saw that we were well fed. Again the homes needed to be cleaned of the water damage.

When Katrina hit New Orleans, again a group was formed, seven KOG folk and one Methodist, Bob. This time we stayed in a church; it had also been hit but our boys cleaned and rebuilt and I cooked. There were several other groups there at the same time. This was a joyful time sharing our work alongside the others. The food was provided from the church pantry (donations).

November 2011 Congregational Council Notes

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 p.m. on November 15 with Gerry Blake presiding. The meeting opened with devotions led by Pastor Cook. She pointed out that the coming Sunday would be Christ the King Sunday as well as our 35th anniversary as a congregation. She asked the Council to reflect on what it is like to be a willing subject in Christ's kingdom. Jesus talked about the kingdom more than anything else. The question was also posed, "How do we at KOG enrich our community re: peace and justice?" Social Ministry is our main outlet for this teaching of Jesus.

Present: Chuck Barringer, Gerry Blake, Pastor Cook, Tony Hernandez, Jeanne Millar, Don Pasquine, Gil Sams and Helen Wiles. Jeri Muller attended to serve as Secretary pro temp. Vaughn Stanaland attended during the treasurer's report. Excused: Frank Fleischer, Nancy Fleischer, Debbie Morris, Calvin Riley and Grace Spainhour.

COUNCIL ACTIONS Action items were reviewed and discussed from the Council Action list.

New actions are:

Tony Hernandez will send a letter to Debbie Smithson and Liza Long requesting that they attend the opening session of the Council meeting at the beginning of each quarter, starting in January. The purpose of this is to ensure that Council is plugged in adequately to the activities of TLC and ASM.

Frank Fleischer will request TLC and ASM to submit budgets for 2012.

MINUTES APPROVAL The minutes from the October council were approved with the following change: The guest preacher's name is Stefan Sultanov and he did not request to preach, but rather was referred to Pastor by other ministers in the area as a possible guest preacher.

COUNCIL LISTENING

Tony presented an issue brought to his attention from two teachers at TLC re: the change of paychecks being issued by the 10th of the month, instead of the 1st, without seeking their opinion. Council did not really understand the issue since this change has been in place since the beginning of the year and there will be twelve paychecks in 2011. Tony was directed to refer the issue to Debbie Smithson.

Vaughn offered that if any employee is suffering an unexpected hardship, then they can apply for a partial advance from their next paycheck with approval being Mutual Ministry and Finance.

TREASURER AND FINANCE REPORT Finance Report for October was approved as submitted. Payment will be made to Synod Mission Support for November based on offering received in October. The report showed a more favorable position when compared to the same time in 2010. The total \$100,000 bequeathed by Ev Waltman has been received.

Cleanup of the Restricted Accounts was requested, as follows:

Move the current Noisy Offering, Food Drive and Angel Food monies into a combined Shelter/Soup Kitchen restricted account. The Noisy Offering restricted account will continue to be used as appropriate for monies that go out quickly to another beneficiary.

Property Maintenance, Organ, Blueberry and Advent monies should be moved into the general fund.

Marty Haugen Workshop should be taken off the books.

PASTOR'S REPORT Combined September and October reports were submitted and accepted as written.

MINISTRY TEAMS

Social Ministry (Jeanne Millar) - Request for the January Noisy offering be designated to NSHH client heating bills was **approved** by Council.

Mutual Ministry (Chuck Barringer) - Mutual Ministry has accepted Verne's request to reduce salary for tax purposes in exchange for some concessions in job content. A request for four versus two weeks of vacation was denied based on policy, but two weeks of continuing education was approved by Mutual Ministry.

Worship and Music (Gil Sams) - Recommendation to have one service at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, Christmas Day was **approved**. Mid-week Advent services start on Nov. 30.

Property Ministry (Gerry Blake) - One half of the chairs that need repair are complete; the remainder will be fixed by next Council meeting. The damage on the roof over the Sanctuary was repaired; it is thought that this should end the leak in the sacristy.

CARE TEAM CONCERNS AND CONGREGATIONAL VISITATION NEEDS Thanks were expressed for the help driving Barbara Schilling to her appointments. Dodie (Dora) White remains at MUSC in Charleston and would like visitors.

November Congregational Council Notes continued

OLD BUSINESS

US Flag Flags have been placed in the sanctuary. This item is closed.

Fundraising Pastor has drafted a KOG policy and a request form that would need to be completed and then sent to Council for approval. A separate meeting is needed for this discussion. Frank to set it up upon his return from vacation.

Church Directory Tony reported that the directory should be completed in the next two weeks.

Bequest Progress Vaughn has sent spreadsheet to Frank with Finance's view on actual expenditures. Teams need to confirm expenditure as part of bequest monies. We need the teams to affirm an estimate for bequest items that remain to be accomplished.

Ministry Team 2012 Budget Submission: Evangelism, Worship and Music, Fellowship and Social Ministry budgets have been submitted. Other team budgets either could not be confirmed or need to be submitted. Submission is to Frank who will then forward to Finance.

NEW BUSINESS

Annual Reports Due January 9, 2012 to the church office.

Annual Meeting 2012 January 22, 2012 is the date of the Annual Meeting.

Mutual Ministry Request Request to also give Debbie Smithson and Liza Long the same \$500 award given to other employees was **approved** from Bequest monies.

CALENDAR REVIEW

Council members to provide setup and cleanup for December 7 Advent supper.

Next council meeting will be Tuesday, December 13th at 6:30.

ADJOURNMENT Meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m., ending with the Lord's Prayer.

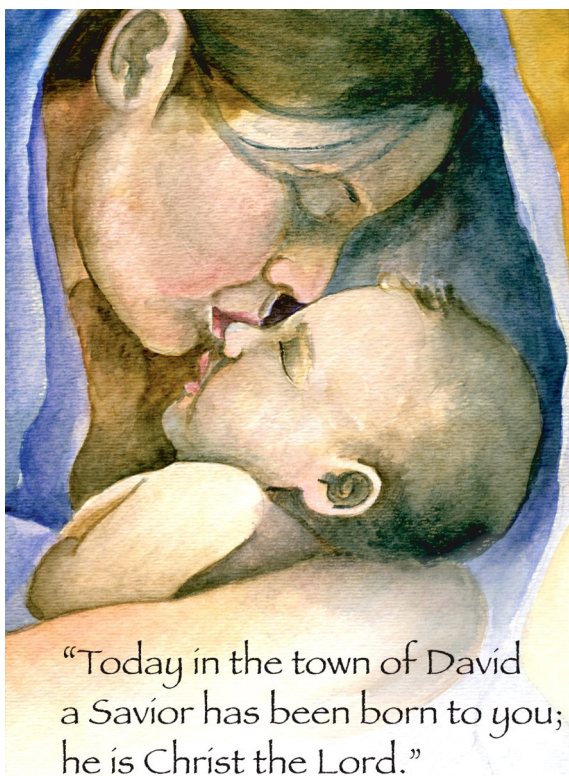
